Fall Fellowship brought together Tipisa Lodge members in person for the first time in months

In September, OA members from across Central Florida gathered for Fall Fellowship, Tipisa Lodge's annual get-together weekend where members can learn and play games with their fellow members. The weekend in September saw 121 total members from eight different chapters attend the event at Camp La-No-Che. The Huracan chapter was represented very well, with its members constituting over 17% of all members in attendance.

Fall Fellowship has been held for many years, yet this year's event was a first of its kind in multiple ways. For one, this was the first major in-person event the lodge has

implemented throughout the event, mandating members to wear a mask at all times (except while eating and sleeping) as well as to practice social distancing throughout their stay. As Huracan Chapter First Vice Chief Marc Homburger-Jacobs recalled,"While it was unfortunate having to keep masks on all the time and social distance, it was great to see everyone out there staying safe."

Despite the less than ideal circumstances, those in attendance were still able to participate in workshops and other fun activities as they have in years past. Another way that this year's Fall Fellowship was different from previous Fall Fellowships was the introduction of the Polestar Induction Leadership Training workshop, which teaches OA chapter officers how to provide an induction experience for incoming members that aligns with national standards. Huracan Chapter Secretary Skyler Swiderski recalled "It was nice to learn more about the program and how we can further integrate practices to encourage more participation and more of the ceremonial practices." Some Huracan members were also able to gain some practical experience as ceremonialists for inductions this winter.
